



Flooding

Protect the lives, property, and environment of our community by reducing the impact of flooding, erosion, and water pollution.



Local Flooding

- Flood risk associated with storm drains and minor channels
- Local flooding occurs away from the creeks
- Overwhelmed drainage systems
- How many homes at risk??





Creek Flooding


- Flood risk associated with larger channels and creeks
- 5,100 buildings flooded by 100-year flood
- 400 roadways at risk of flooding in 100year flood





Erosion

- Protect property from erosion
- Restore channel stability
- Improve flood conveyance
- Improve water quality













WPD Funding Sources






