

CodeNEXT Update

Although a third and final draft of CodeNEXT was supposed to be released in late November, that release has been pushed back to February 12, giving the public a short time to digest the final version of the text and maps before the city council attempts to review and pass the document in April. Currently, they have scheduled only two public hearings for consideration before the council and one opportunity before the Planning Commission. Look to the BNA website for updates on the status and a review of Version 3. There is also a movement to allow citizens to vote on the rezoning of the city, instead of it being passed by a simple majority of the council. Ryan Drive Redevelopment

Things are finally starting to brew for redeveloping the parcel of land at the intersection of Ryan Drive and Justin Lane. Currently underutilized as an Austin Energy storage facility, the City of Austin is now exploring a more appropriate use for this centrally located space near Crestview Station.

In spring 2018, the City of Austin Office of Real Estate Services will draft a request for proposals to redevelop this Crestview site. Because the City is planning to retain

ownership of the land, city staff would like to determine and define best use of the land through the solicitation of community input.

A working group of 14 citizen volunteers was formed in January to review the plan and to gather input from residents of nearby neighborhoods. The group represents a crosssection of residents, professions, and perspectives from the Crestview, Brentwood, Midtown, and Highland neighborhoods and is facilitated by CNA executive board members Anne-Charlotte Patterson and Nancy Barnard, with support from the office of council member Leslie Pool. The group will create an online community survey, review and quantify survey results, and craft a recommendation matrix. A community meeting will be held in the early spring to update neighbors and to present the group's findings.

Romeria Bicycle Project Proposal


An East-West Bicycle mobility corridor is proposed for Romeria and Denson, with Romeria being designated a neighborhood bikeway. ATD is proposing safety enhancements on Romeria Drive and Denson Drive that are expected to provide a positive impact on calming traffic speeds, improve crossings for people walking and improve comfort and safety for people traveling by bicycle. The City Council Bicycle Master Plan recommends that Denson and Romeria be part of a cross town east-west bicycle route with proposed improvements intended to make these streets suitable for bicycling by people of all ages and abilities. The east-west bicycle route would connect to Lamar Middle School, McCallum High School, Reilly Elementary School, Austin Community College Highland Campus, and Harris Elementary School from Brentwood to Windsor Park.

The proposed improvements include (see next page):





Romeria Drive (from Burnet Road to N. Lamar Blvd.) This a low-volume neighborhood street has received several applications from residents for speed mitigation. The proposal is to make this road a Neighborhood Bikeway, otherwise known as a "Quiet Street". Neighborhood Bikeways are low speed and volume streets with convenient and safe crossings of busy streets, good wayfinding, and clear support for people riding bicycles in the street. This proposal includes new locations for traffic calming devices to reduce auto speeds, including planted median islands. The 300' of Romeria Drive between Burnet Road and Laird Drive is proposed to prohibit on-street motor vehicle parking on both sides of the street to accommodate a dedicated left turn lane and bicycle lanes.

Denson Drive (from N. Lamar Blvd. to Airport Blvd.) The proposal includes two-way protected bicycle lanes on the south side of the street, adjacent to Reilly Elementary. To add bicycle facilities, on-street motor vehicle parking is proposed to be prohibited on the south side of the street in locations as shown here:

AISD published a preliminary schedule for construction activities related to the 2017 bond measure, including the project to modernize Brentwood Elementary. Selection of contractors for the project and design work will happen between January 2019 and March 2020. It is expected that AISD will collect community feedback during this time. Construction at Brentwood is scheduled to begin in April 2020 and should be complete by August 2022. The plan is to sequence construction to allow students to stay on-site while the project is ongoing. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$35.764 million. As part of the district-wide modernization plans, Lucy Read will close as a Pre-Kindergarten and some students from nearby Doss Elementary will attend Lucy Read during construction at Doss. The Lucy Read site will be the new home of the Rosedale School after its modernization is complete in 2021.





McCallum Football Historic Season: 14 Victories, 2 Steps Short!

After 5 months of workouts, weights, August practices, ten regular season games and a deep run into the UIL Playoffs, McCallum football suffered its lone loss December 16 at NRG Stadium in Houston. The 14-1 win/loss record is the best since MAC first "teed it up" in 1953. College Station High School, barely 5 years old, simply had a little more speed and great skilled talent, beating the Knights 49-21. The McCallum 1966 football team, the only other MAC football team to achieve 12-0 before losing in the Playoffs, was honored in a pre-game ceremony along with Coach Pete Peterson at the Dec 2 game.

Providing exceptional support all season was the outstanding A.N. McCallum High School Marching Band, the Color Guard and the Cheerleading Squad. The band marched in the Alamodome in November, as a Finalist in the UIL State Championships.
