#### FROM YOUR ASSOCIATION BOARD

Dear Northwood Neighbors,

As we begin a new year, we would like to reflect on the accomplishments of the past year and let you know some of our priorities for 2007. Among our accomplishments in 2006, we revived the Northwood Neighborhood Association web site, replaced aging Neighborhood Watch signs and, with the help of Eagle Scout Sheldon Hoes, a new message board was installed near the Silver Creek entrance. During the last few months of 2006, considerable time was spent fighting and then negotiating the terms of the office building project near the intersection of Oak Creek and MoPac.

During 2007, we hope to refocus our efforts on the beautification of the Silver Creek entrance, by installing a metal Northwood sign on the concrete wall. The wall and the grassy area belong to the Texas Department of Transportation, but TxDOT has indicated a willingness to work with us on this proposal. If anyone would like to contribute time or expertise to this project, please contact Cyndi Stein, Association Vice-President, at 255-5929.

Come Springtime, we will ask the Texas Forest Service to survey the neighborhood for signs of Oak Wilt, and offer assistance to homeowners whose trees may be at risk of infection. We will also monitor the construction of the office building to ensure that the developers comply with our agreement.

Also, if you would like to volunteer your time, there are many ways to do so, from delivering the newsletter to helping with special events such as the Easter Egg hunt, or helping with issues and projects as they arise.

## Collar and Tag Pets!

In December a dog escaped from its home and was picked up by some neighbors – it had a harness and leash but no collar or tags. In short, no identification. The neighbors were unable to keep it inside even overnight so they took it to the pound.

The next day "lost dog" notices with photos of that dog were posted; the owners were

called and picked up the dog from the pound. Fortunately, that story has a happy ending.

Pets do escape sometimes. Please be sure to put a collar and ID tag on your pet. Even better, ask your vet to insert an ID microchip – those can't come off and guarantee that the pet can be identified if it ends up at the pound.

#### 2006 Northwood Home Sales

According to Realtor Barbara
Hilliard, in 2006 there
were 35 Northwood
houses sold. The
lowest sales price

was \$134,000, the highest was \$225,000. The average sales price was \$185,758, the average price per square foot was \$107.69 and the average days on market was 42.

Looking back, in 2005, 32 Northwood homes sold. The lowest sales price was \$142,900 and the highest sales price was \$210,000. The average sales price was \$174,824 and the average days on market was 36. The average price per square foot was \$96.27.

In 2004, 23 homes were sold in Northwood, ranging from \$125,000 to \$208,500. The

average days on market was 47. In 2003, 33 homes sold, with prices between \$129,000 and \$199,999. The average days on the market was 58 and the average sales price was \$153,000. In 2002, 25 homes sold in Northwood, between \$117,200 and \$197,177. The average days on market was 49 and the average sales price was \$159,296.

In 2001 28 homes were sold in Northwood. The lowest price paid was \$139,500 and the highest price was \$179,900. and the average number of days on the market was 30 and the average sales price was in the mid to upper \$150s with the average price per square foot at \$89. &

### Bedbugs

By Wizzie Brown, A&M Texas Cooperative Extension Program Specialist – who recently handled a bedbug problem in central Austin Bedbugs are small, dark brown to reddish colored insects that are oval and have no wings. The color and size can depend on whether or not the insect is engorged with blood. Bedbugs feed on blood of warmblooded mammals. Fortunately, it has not been proven that bedbugs spread disease within the United States, but they can cause their victims much discomfort. Bedbugs are spread mainly through clothing and luggage of travelers or by using secondhand bedroom furniture.

Bedbugs feed mostly at night, piercing the skin while people sleep. The bugs inject a fluid while feeding that can cause skin to become irritated and itchy. The welts left behind usually form elongated, spindle-shaped markings. If left undisturbed, bedbugs feed for about 3-5 minutes, then crawl to their hiding place to digest their food for several days.



When there is a bedbug infestation, they may be found hiding along the seams and/ or covers of mattresses. They may also move to behind baseboards, window and door casings, behind pictures, in furniture, behind loose wallpaper or in folds of curtains.



To manage bedbug populations, you may want to contact a pest management professional. You can help them by doing some of

the following:

- Vacuum any bugs that you find in the area
- Reduce clutter to eliminate hiding places
- Clean infested area thoroughly, paying close attention to cracks and crevices
- Pull bed away from the wall
- Do not allow sheets or dust ruffle to touch the floor
- Caulk and seal holes around pipe penetrations.
